In *The Tourist Trap* Jack explores the feelings we have when in unfamiliar territory, a heady mixture of excitement and trepidation, and how we deal with the dilemma of when to trust and when to be wary of the unknown. Against the backdrop of a bright summer's day, the image shows two predatory young men closing in on an innocent and susceptible young female tourist. The idea behind this painting came from Jack's response to an Ian McEwan novel, *The Comfort of Strangers*, the complex story of a couple who, while holidaying in Venice, are seduced by charismatic strangers who have their own sinister motives.
